CHS STUDENTS VIVIDLY VISIBLE FOR VIETNAM!



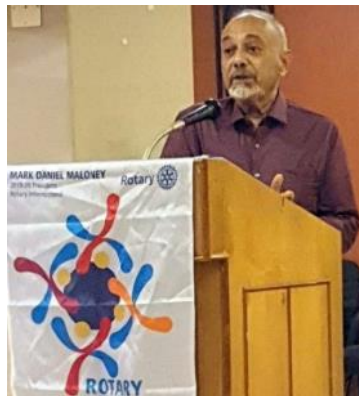
