1996 TATTERSALL'S BOAT & OUTDOOR LEISURE SHOW - ANNUAL REPORT.

I have much pleasure in presenting this annual report to The Rotary Club of Howrah on the extremely successful "1996 Tattersall's Boat & Outdoor Leisure Show" conducted in Hobart 11-13 October 1996

Background

In mid 1994 a group of members from the Rotary Club of Howrah was given the club's approval to conduct an "Outdoor Leisure Show" in Hobart in 1995.

This committee was very pleased to secure Tattersall's as naming rights sponsor of the 1995 show for a fee of \$15,000, however, in early August 1995 it became evident that the committee had not gained sufficient industry support to guarantee an outstanding show and it was decided to cancel the exhibition for 1995.

The committee, subsequently, entered into an agreement with the Boating Industry Association of Victoria (BIA, Vic) to jointly conduct the 1996 Tattersall's Boat & Outdoor Leisure Show at Princes Wharf, Hobart. Our agreement extends for two more years and the two organisations will jointly conduct the 1997 and 1998 shows.

1996 Tattersall's Boat & Outdoor Leisure Show

The show which was managed by Mr. Larry Ponting, of the BIA, Vic. was an incredible success with 38 exhibitors filling the venue to capacity.

A Marina was established on the water especially for the show and this allowed the exhibition of luxury cruising craft, tourist cruise operators, and historic sailing vessels.

The massive 'Supertank', which was shipped from Melbourne and stocked with a variety of Tasmania's finest angling fish, provided a tremendous drawcard for freshwater fishers, while "Flathead Fred's, Fishing Clinics for Children", entertained and enthralled literally thousands of children and adults alike.

Advertising and Promotion

The advertising and promotion for the show was comprehensive. Ancillary sponsorship agreements were made with WIN TV, Radio 7HO-FM and the Mercury Newspaper to maximise the advertising coverage and effectiveness and due to these sponsorship arrangements, the overall media placements far exceeded the \$18,000 outlaid.

Public Response

Over 10,000 people attended the show and extremely positive comments were received from those attending.

Exhibitor Survey

A survey was sent to all exhibitors immediately following the show and approximately 66% responded, Over 90% were happy with the show and indicated that they would exhibit again, with 36% requiring more space.

Finance 4 1 2 1

The project returned a surplus of \$14,656 and an equal disbursement of \$7000 was made to the BIA, Vic and to our club. Additionally, we earned \$3,350 for manning the gates, casual labour and cleaning. The nett return to the club was \$10,350 and this figure exceeded our budgeted profit by \$2,000.

Conclusion

I would like to sincerely thank all members of the project committee, Lindsay Grenfell and Larry Ponting of the BIA, every member of the club and their family members, who contributed to the outstanding success of this project. It has been a long and sometimes, frustrating task, which stretched our manpower resources to the limit, but it is one of the more financially successful projects we have ever undertaken. It has the potential to raise many thousands of dollars in future years. The club can be justly proud of this project, and I genuinely thank you all for your tremendous and unselfish support.

We registered with the District G.S.E. Chairman Frank Henderson as a potential host club for part of the stay of the ARIZONA TEAM members however we were unsuccessful in this endeavour.

INTERNATIONAL NIGHT

A very successful dinner was held at the Sunshine Centre with the self catered meal comprising dishes from many ethnic backgrounds. Those attending were treated to a wonderful display of team dancing by the Polish Hobart Dance Troupe which was arranged by George Topfer, thank you George. Our thanks also go to Jacob and Mary George for organising the evening and to the many members who attended in national dress.

YOUTH EXCHANGE

New members with young families are encouraged to consider becoming involved in these programmes during their children's progress through school years.

R.A.W.C.S.

ROTARY CLUB OF HOWRAH COMMUNITY SERVICE - ANNUAL REPORT 1996/97

The following report outlines activities conducted for community service in 1996/97.

- 1. A hospital bed was purchased for, and presented to, The Lillian Martin Home for the Aged. This was required to equip a room dedicated for respite care. The unit cost \$1,211.
- 2. Funds were made available to Primary and Secondary schools in our area to enable them to purchase prizes for good citizenship. The schools receiving awards were:

Primary Schools: Cambridge, Clarendon Vale, Howrah, Lauderdale,

Richmond, Rokeby, South Arm.

Special School: Wentworth Support School.

Private Schools: Emmanuel Christian (Rokeby), John Paul II (Rokeby), St.

Johns (Richmond).

Rotarians attended at most of the school presentation ceremonies to award the prizes. The total cost of awards was \$850.

- 3. Funds were provided for the Rokeby Christian Care Association to enable the purchase of school shoes for disadvantaged children in Rokeby and Clarendon Vale areas. A budget of \$700 was allocated.
- 4. Donations were made to the following:

St. Johns School (Richmond)	\$250.00
Salvation Army Christian Appeal	\$500.00
Aust. Rotary Health Research Fund	\$500.00
District Cardiology Project	\$500.00
Windward Bound Trust	\$200.00

- 5. A number of videos on "Road Safety" have been passed on from the Community Service Committee for 1995/96. Due to a major effort by past District Governor Alan Leth these have been offered to other Rotary Clubs for sale to appropriate community groups. Response is slow but approximately \$200 has been raised to date. A number of copies are to be given to local aged people homes, schools, police, etc.
- 6. As in previous years the Governor invited Howrah Rotary to cater for the public on the open day at Government House. Splendid support from our ladies enabled the sale of large numbers of Devonshire Teas and Rotarians provided other food and drinks. The event raised \$1222.50 and provided a great opportunity for fellowship.

- 7. The Royal Hobart Golf Club invited Howrah Rotary Club to sell refreshments at a hole during their Golf Charity Day. This raised \$750.00. The assistance of President John Anderson in obtaining this event is appreciated.
- 8. Through the Rotary Club of Canberra a donation of \$185.00 was made to "Rotary Against Malaria". This project is likely to replace "Polio Plus" as an international project and further support is merited.
- 9. A small committee was formed to determine further expenditure of community service funds. A report has been submitted to the club which identifies a number of high priority areas. An initial project investigated from this report is the provision of a skateboard ramp in the Rokeby area. Several discussions with Clarence Council officers have obtained their support and an item has been included in the Council budget for 1997/98. Subject to formal council approval on 16 June 1997 the club would be required to contribute \$5000 towards the project and will assist in preparing the site.
- 10. Rokeby High School is operating a programme that targets young adolescents who find attendance and participation at school difficult. This is the M.A.R.S.S.S. programme "Managing and Retaining Secondary School Students". A donation of \$200 has been made to assist in the initial set up, but it is hoped to arrange for future activities to be self funding, and for club members to provide assistance as required.
- 11. Projects still under investigation are as follows:
 - Assistance to Menzies Foundation in partial funding for research into Melanoma in Tasmania.
 - Support for Lindisfarne Rowing Club.

- Support for Heartbeat Tasmania Inc., in purchase of equipment for the Royal Hobart Hospital.
- Approach to Rokeby High School to provide support for "A Tidy Towns" project directed at restoration and maintenance in graveyard at St. Mathews, Rokeby.

Support from the Community Service Committee and other Rotarians during the year has been much appreciated.
