ANOTHER HEALTH CAMP IN PAKISTAN

It was with great pleasure we presented Rotarian and Chairman of the Jad-o-Jehad Foundation Numan Rasul with a "big cheque" for \$2000 to support another Health and Physio Camp in Pakistan. The camp will be organized by the Foundation and will see hundreds of patients provided with free medicines health screening by doctors and physiotherapists in remote areas of Pakistan. Even though Numan is not travelling to Pakistan this time he does lots of the pre-planning and will be involved in the organisation of the camp which is the third to be held this year. Our Club is proud to be a sponsor of such a worthy cause.

FROM CLUB ASSEMBLY

- President Reg led a discussion about the management structures of our Club, detailing the role of directors and their committees. Reg also advised in his second year of Presidency that there would be a new Club Administration Committee which will be coordinated by Rotarian George Toepfer. Members can opt into one or more of the five committees for the 2024/25 Rotary Year.
- There will be a Changeover Meeting on 27th June at which the Annual and Financial Reports will be presented to the membership. The 2024/25 Board will be the same as this year. The new district Governor will be our guest at the meeting.
- Funds raised in the first fortnight of trading at the Rotary Bookshop in the Shoreline Plaza will be put to good use soon. Bookshop Coordinator Terry Evans has been in touch with the Clarence City Council to seek permission to provide a defibrillator at the Meehan Range Mountain Bike Park. The Club will purchase the machine at a cost of \$2600 and the CCC will install and maintain the defibrillator at an appropriate site. Signage acknowledging our Club will also be installed.
- It was agreed by the membership that our Club will support Jack Beard who has been selected in an underage Tasmanian Touch Football Team to compete in a national tournament later this year. Jack lives in Howrah and attends a local school. He will be invited to join us at a Club meeting to hear about his selection soon.
- Our Club will also apply for a District Grant to help support the development of an outdoor garden at the Women's Prison. Rotarian Bob Hardy will coordinate the project.
- Last week on Wednesday June 12th our Club had its 48th Birthday. It was decided that in two years time we will celebrate the 50th in grand style. Club Administration Coordinator George is seeking suggestions from members about the planning of this milestone event.
- Treasurer Gayle gave us some information about "The Bowl" in which members put their loose change at each Thursday's meetings. By the end of the year we usually raise approximately \$250 which is then donated to Aust. Rotary Health.
