centred around Christmas Eve when all the action happens. For example the Xmas tree is decorated, people head to Xmas markets to stock up on all manner of treats. Santa Claus doesn't deliver German children's gifts. Christkind does on 24th December. When children hear a bell ring the know their gifts have arrived.

Germans usually don't have their main dinner on the 25th, but on the 24th. This is also the time when Christmas gifts are unwrapped, usually after dinner. Karin provided some delicious treats for us to

try and Stollen was favourite in her childhood. It is a yeast bread that is baked with dried fruits, candied citrus peel, nuts and spices. Xmas in Germany happens in winter

so a popular drink is Glühwein a hot spiced wine that is a staple at German Christmas markets. Karin brought some for us to sample which went down well with Elaine Hardy's stollen. Many thanks Karin for a really interesting presentation.
