PHIL TYSON - SOUND PRESERVATION ASS. OF TASMANIA.

The Sound Preservation Association of Tasmania (SPAT) works to preserve Tasmania's unique audio history. They are a not-for-profit, volunteer-run organisation made up of like-minded people whose interests and aims are to identify, collect, and preserve recorded sound, equipment, literature, memorabilia and oral histories related to Tasmania's past, present and future.



Our Guest Speaker Phil Tyson has had leadership roles in SPAT for many years and his presentation was

fascinating and at times nostalgic, bringing back memories of the days before television and the internet. SPAT holds many collections of recorded sounds and



sound makers like radios, music machines, telephones, vinyl records, tapes, cassettes, gathered since it was founded in 1985 by the late Gwen D'Emden OAM and a small group of friends. Since then, the collection has grown by donation and on occasions by purchase to hundreds of records and objects dating back to the early nineteen hundreds. We thank Phil for his excellent presentation and the display of some wonderful examples of what is exhibited at their headquarters in the old Bellerive Post Office, where visitors are most welcome.
