Emily and Justin are members of the Communication and Engagement team for Marinus Link. Emily is the team Manager. Their role is to engage with the Tasmanian community to explain what Marinus Link is all about and

its potential benefits to all power users in the state. Marinus Link is a proposed electricity and telecommunications interconnector between Tasmania and Victoria.

It will enable the flow of electricity in both directions between the two states, delivering low-cost, reliable and clean energy for customers in the National Electricity Market (NEM). It will enable excess energy generated on the mainland to be stored in Tasmania's hydro storage, and made available for use

when NEM demand outstrips supply. Tasmania's renewable energy and storage resources will also be available for use throughout the NEM as a result of Marinus Link.
