Anne Sheehan - "Behind the Badge"

URSULA TAYLOR - DERWENT ESTUARY PROGRAM

Ursula is the CEO of the Derwent Estuary Program and has worked there for 19 years. The Derwent estuary stretches from New Norfolk to the Iron Pot and covers an area of 200 square kilometres. For many years it has faced some serious threats to its health mainly from big two large industrial plants, a paper mill in the upper section and a zinc manufacturer in Hobart, combined with stormwater, waste water treatment plants, fish and land farming. So serious are the threats that in the 1970's the Derwent was considered the "most polluted river in the world".

Times have changed however and so has public support and awareness of the need to improve the condition of the estuary. The DEP was formed in 1999 with its main roles being monitoring of water quality, strategic planning and community education. The

DEP has formed partnerships with the industry, all six councils the river flows through, Hydro Tas. and IMAS. Monthly testing data shows gradual improvements are being made, the big polluters are working on improving their production methods and systems to avoid contamination as have community attitudes and a drive to protect the river to allow people use and enjoy it as well as protecting the diverse marine life living in the estuary. As evidenced by all twenty of the beach water testing sites being good or fair for swimming for this coming summer. We thank Ursula for a really interesting and informative presentation.
