It was a delight to listen to our young beekeepers, Reuben, Lilith, Audrey and their mentor and founder of the Tas. Junior Beekeepers Anita Long. The team needed to raise \$38 000 to fund their trip to Slovenia to compete in the International competition of Young Beekeepers. Our Club supported the team in its funding goal. The meeting was held in July 2023 with 150 participants from 30 countries. The team members performed really well with Reuben finishing second in the individual competition. Following the meeting the team travelled to Venice and the Netherlands where they visited the world's largest seed company. It has a warehouse that holds enough carrot seeds to feed the globe for three years. They also learned

about the Varroa mite which has a devastating impact on honey bees. It was a fantastic trip of a lifetime with lots of learning, fun and friends made during the adventure. Pictured from the left are Audrey, Lilith, Reuben and mentor Anita who is also Audrey's mum.




MORE FROM THE BEEKEEPERS

Audrey, Lilith and Reuben all have at least one hive of bees of their own to work with, while Reuben is caring for six hives. All are members of the Tas. Junior Beekeepers which has over 120 children aged between 7 and 17 participating in Beekeeping activities each week at their centre in Richmond. All spoke with confidence and enthusiasm about their wonderful experiences in Europe and their love of beekeeping was clearly obvious.

Anita is also a passionate and committed Beekeeper and President of the Tas. Junior Beekeepers. She was already in Europe when the rest of the team arrived because she was on her Churchill Fellowship to learn how other countries organize and conduct programs for junior beekeepers. Anita was able to travel to Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovenia, England and Scotland. She was really impressed with a Scottish high school where students are learning about beekeeping as part of their curriculum.




CHANGEOVER MEETING 27th JUNE
