To support Australian Rotary Health, Salamanca RC are organising the Walk for Mental Health event which will be held on Sunday 15th October departing from Simmons Park Lindisfarne at 10.00am with Check In at 9.30am.

Starting from Simmons Park on the Esplanade in Lindisfarne the route will be towards and under the Tasman Bridge and on to Montagu Bay and Rosny Point. Walkers have the option of turning around at any point along the route. Simmons Park - Montagu Bay = 5.2km return and Simmons Park - Rosny Point = 8.4km return

Registering on the day will be available but will not include the T-shirt. Credit card facilities will be available. Participants are requested to bring their own water bottles.
