

### JOHN SARGENT - HISTORY OF THE DERWENT FERRIES ....

John is fifth generation to continue living in Bellerive. It seems fitting that his house is beside the Derwent River and quite close to the ferry terminal in Bellerive. What is also interesting is that he has a close personal connection through his mother who was a member of the O'May family. The O'May family dominated trans-Derwent ferries from 1863 until Hobart's floating bridge opened in 1943. John began with the first ferries which were used to transport food and water to the convicts in the early days of the settlement of Hobart. As the colony grew so did the ferries transporting all manner goods in both directions across the

river. They also gave access to Richmond Sorell and Port Arthur. John had many anecdotes to keep us interested, like the "ferry wars between Lindisfarne and Bellerive all over the extra penny it cost for the people of "Dog Town" (Lindisfarne) to get to Hobart. The first car ferry was the *P.S. Kangaroo* which ran for over 70 years. Ferries made a comeback after the Tasman Bridge disaster made their use essential to help commuters get to and from for work more easily. It also saw the rise of the Clifford family as successful ferry operators and builders. We thank John for another really interesting presentation.
