CLARENCE HIGH'S "GAME ON" DAYGame On! fosters community spirit by bringing together Clarence High School Year 7 students and members of the Rotary Clubs of Bellerive and Howrah, together with local officers from Tasmania Police. The event seeks to use the shared experience of game playing to promote enjoyable social connection within informal and very supportive environments located within the school.

When Who How:

When and Who: Wednesday 11th December 2024 at CHS Green space, lunch space, Northern Field and gym at the school. 48 Year 7 students and some staff members; Rotarians, volunteers and police officers.

How: Through assembly and other communication options, Year 7 students are invited to register their interest in participating in Game On! Day. Those who register are provided with a card which enables them to receive a tick of confirmation from a teacher that they have shown behaviour or attitudes which align with the **Rotary 4 Way-Test** (fairness, truth, goodwill and friendship, beneficial to all). Students who have received the appropriate endorsement (we hope 48 in all) are then able to access, on 11th December, a BBQ lunch, followed by 45 minutes of games:

Group One Board and card games (Uno, Ludo, Chinese Checkers); one adult ,3students; 15minute rotation, i.e. students play three different games for 15 minutes each game.

Group Two: Gym games: like table tennis and carpet bowls One adult with 3 students; 15-minute rotation, i.e. students play three different games for 15 minutes.

Group Three: participating in modified Tas Police recruitment physical requirements.
