Since its founding in 1989 by a small group of concerned parents in Queensland, STEPS Group has continued to empower individuals to achieve, breaking down barriers, and driving change across our communities. As a national not-for-profit organisation, they are a passionate provider of training, employment, and community services that aim to improve accessibility, reduce poverty and isolation, and help people harness their potential leading to happier, healthier lives.

The Steps program aims to provide options on their road to independence, purpose and a meaningful job. As an approved NDIS provider, STEPS offers personalized disability support services that prioritizes individual needs. The STEPS process begins with learning basic skills for living independently through, learning work skills and job readiness and finally to achieve fulfilling employment. Some

participants can attend the Pathways College in Caloundra, Queensland.

The boarding students reside in a modern, fully fitted and contained units designed to reflect an independent living environment. We

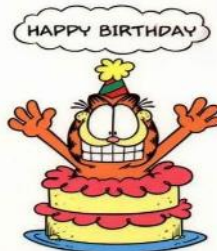
