
At three o'clock we slowly packed up and all being really zapped out, looked forward to a

• Another event will be Face Painting at Ninja Arena formerly Blundstone Arena with Cricket Australia providing a marquee and our Club charging Cricket Australia instead of individuals. The date is Monday 18 November with up to 6 members including Numan Rasul whose idea it has been to provide this event for members of the cricket public. Numan Rasul, a STEPS Trainer and member of the Rotary Club of Howrah, suggested that the Rotary Club provide work experience to STEPS Work Mates participants. "This kind of work experience is invaluable. They'll get support from our STEPS Work Mates Trainers and the Rotary Club members in a safe environment that contributes to community initiatives and causes. Like the Rotary Club, STEPS is a non-profit organisation which empowers individuals and communities, so I know our participants are excited to work hard and give back," Numan said.
